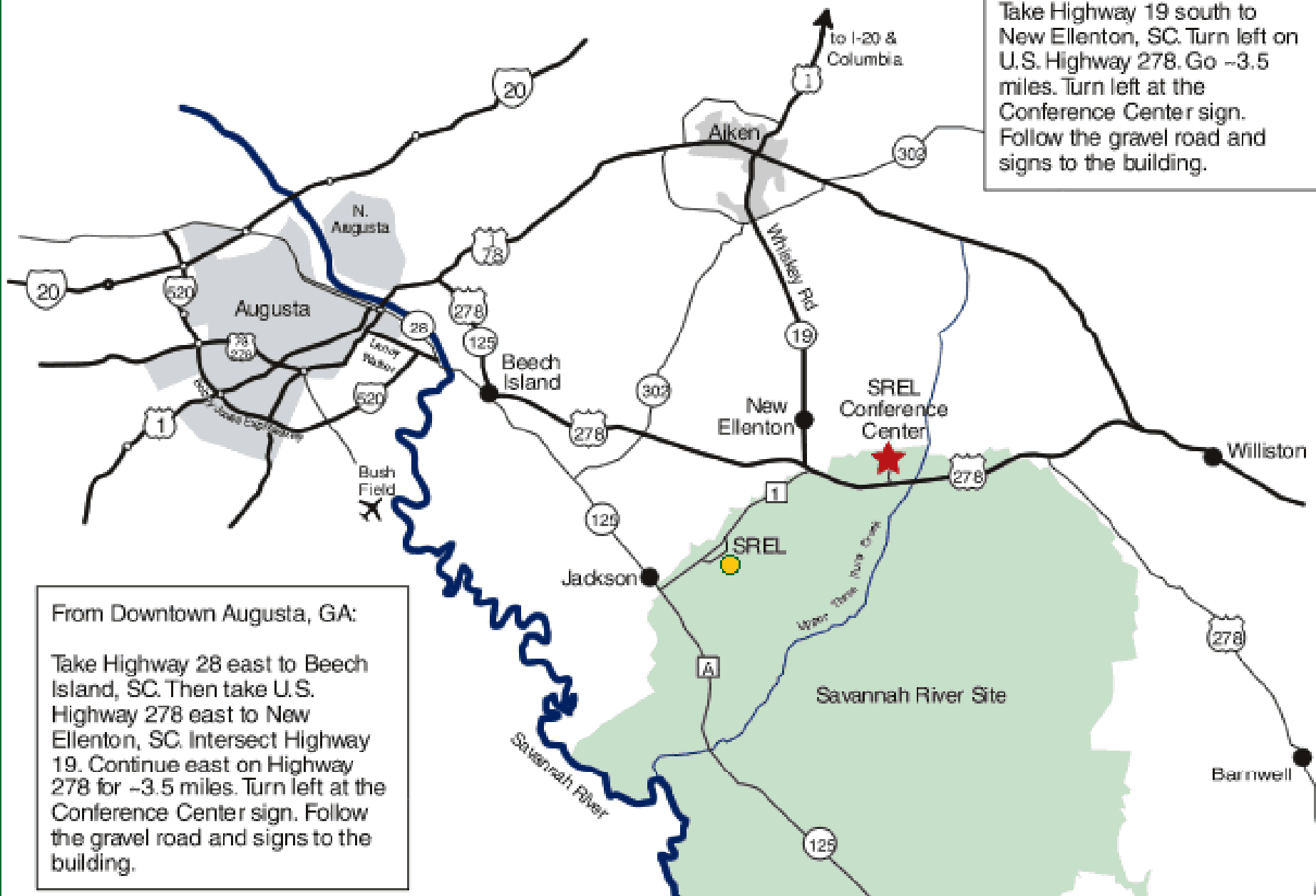

Directions to the SREL Conference Center


From Aiken, SC:

Take Highway 19 south to New Ellenton, SC. Turn left on U.S. Highway 278. Go ~3.5 miles. Turn left at the Conference Center sign. Follow the gravel road and signs to the building.



From Downtown Augusta, GA:

Take Highway 28 east to Beech Island, SC. Then take U.S. Highway 278 east to New Ellenton, SC. Intersect Highway 19. Continue east on Highway 278 for ~3.5 miles. Turn left at the Conference Center sign. Follow the gravel road and signs to the building.





- Compliance for emission limits on vehicles, farming, and lawn care equipment




